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Dear Reader,

February holds a profound place in the heart of Bangladesh. It is a reminder of who we are and how our nation came into being. On 21st February 1952, young people stepped forward with courage and clarity, demanding the right to speak in their mother tongue. Some of them never returned home. Their sacrifice was not about language alone; it was about dignity, identity and the fundamental right to be heard. The existence of Bangladesh is deeply rooted in that moment.

Because of this history, language is never a casual matter for us. Words shape thought. Vocabulary, in particular, determines how precisely we can express ideas and emotions. A limited vocabulary restricts thinking; a rich one expands it. When students know the right words, they gain confidence. When teachers use language carefully, learning becomes clearer. When parents value strong language, conversations at home become more meaningful.

Developing language and vocabulary does not happen only through textbooks. It grows through reading regularly, across genres and languages. It grows through listening attentively, noticing new words and using them in speech and writing. Encouraging students to ask questions, keep word journals, engage in discussions and write with intention all contribute to stronger language skills.

This year, let us honour the language martyrs not only through ceremonies but through daily action. We can commit to speaking respectfully, writing carefully, reading more and consciously expanding our vocabulary. In doing so, we keep the spirit of Ekushey February alive, not just in memory but in practice, every single day.
