The casual use of inappropriate language or slang, as well as exposure to content that includes age-inappropriate expressions, can influence how children communicate and interact with others. Encouraging respectful communication at home will greatly reinforce the values we aim to instill at school.

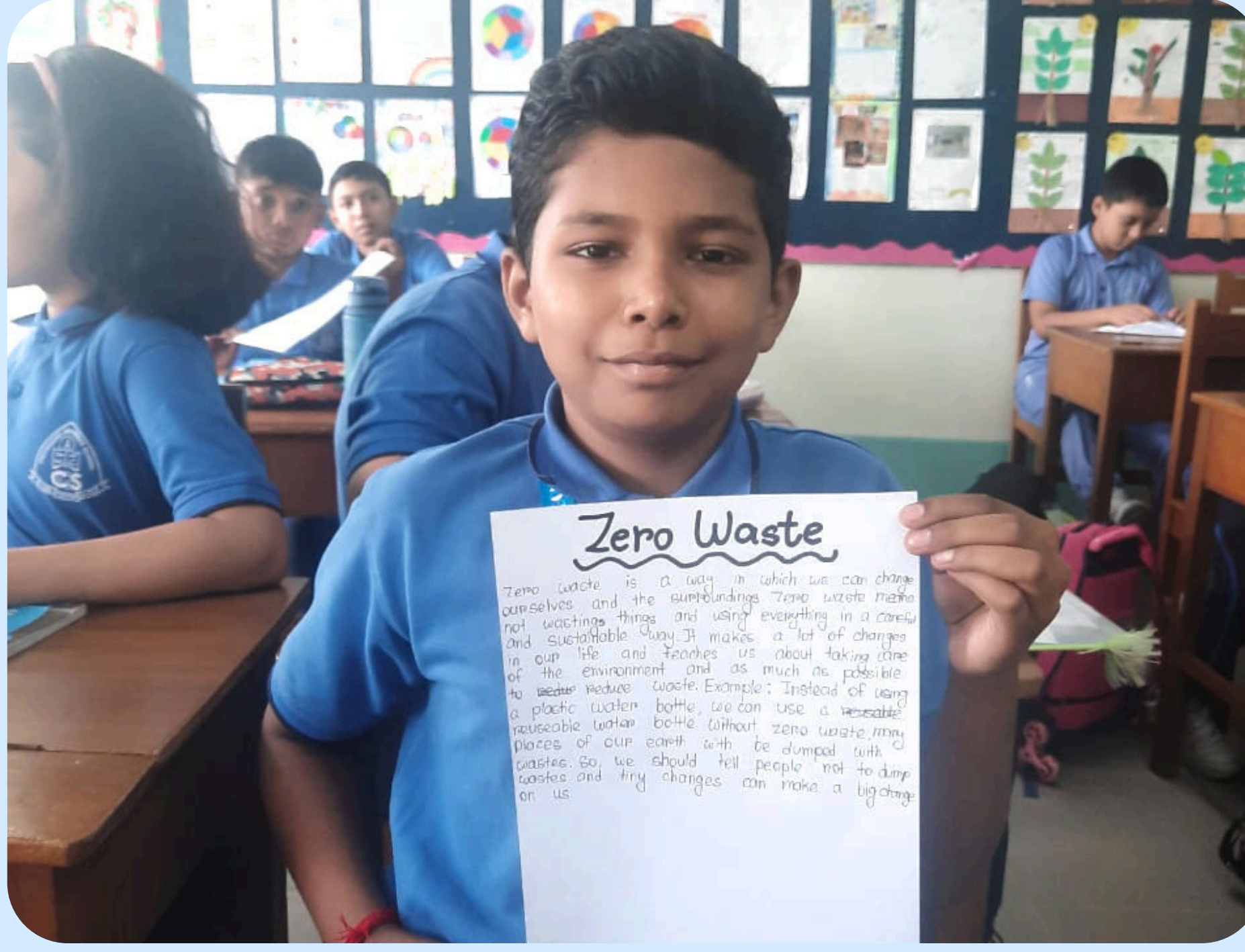


Bridging Worlds: Round Square Meeting in Germany

Dear Reader

As we approach the final eight weeks of the academic session, the rhythm of the year begins to shift. Much of the syllabus has been covered, routines are familiar and attention gradually turns towards consolidation and reflection. This phase, though quieter, is one of the most important parts of the learning journey, as it determines how well earlier efforts are understood and retained.

The closing stretch is not about rushing through new content. It is about strengthening what has already been learned. Concepts need revisiting, connections need to be reinforced and gaps need timely attention. Small areas of confusion, if overlooked, can quickly grow and affect overall confidence. At the same time, consistent effort during these weeks can lead to meaningful improvement and a deeper sense of clarity.

It is also natural, at this stage, for focus to fluctuate. After months of steady work, a dip in momentum can occur. This is where discipline quietly takes the place of motivation. Showing up prepared, staying organized, completing tasks on time and maintaining regular revision are simple habits that make a significant difference.

For parents, this is a time to observe patterns rather than react to isolated moments. Encouragement and calm guidance are far more effective than pressure. When children feel supported and clear about expectations, they are better able to stay steady and engaged.

The final weeks of any journey often shape the overall outcome. With steady effort, thoughtful support and a clear focus, this period can become one of meaningful progress and quiet confidence.
